

Designing the new Programme



WHY? for identifying the needs and challenges that will be addressed by the Research Program and for establishing the most important key topics related to each thematic area (Environment, Energy, Health, Social Sciences and Humanities, ICT and Biotechnologies)



WHERE? in 4 regions with relevant scientific community in RO, as follows:

Bucharest 21.02.2017 lasi 24.02.2017 Cluj-Napoca 28.02.2017 Timisoara 02.03.2017

the results have been presented and discussed between Romanian and Norwegian experts in a final meeting in Oslo (Research Cooperation Working Group) – March 2017 and have been included in the CN

Elaboration of Programme Implementation Agreement (PAI) signed between NFP and PO

#### **Mid November 2017**

PO send the final form of PA + annexes to FMO in order to be approved by Donors



#### **Mid July 2017**

PO sent to FMO the first draft of supplementary information requested



FMO sent to PO the first comments on supplementary information + the drafts of PA annexes

#### Eligible applicants (PPs):

#### **Eligible partners:**

Research organizations, as defined in the Community Framework for State Aid for RDI (2014/C 198/01), and companies established in RO and NO, IS and LI (in case of EEA FM call) / established in RO and NO (in case of NO FM call)

Partnerships with entities from the relevant DSs is mandatory within research projects selected under the two calls

SGS (Small Grant Scheme)

shall be launched under the NO FM

Call timing: 2018 and 2019
Total available amount:
2,500,000 euro
Min/Max grant:
5,000 / 50,000 euro

#### **Eligible applicants:**

RO institutions representing RO candidates who have received a favourable rating from a previous ERC evaluation (score B in the first or second stage)

Special concerns to be followed under selection procedure for research projects

- key topic 'Carbon capture and storage' shall be prioritised under the NO FM call for proposals for research projects
- at least 10% of the eligible expenditure of the programme shall be dedicated to improve the situation for the Roma population
- gender studies and social inclusion studies will be reflected in the final list of projects receiving funding


